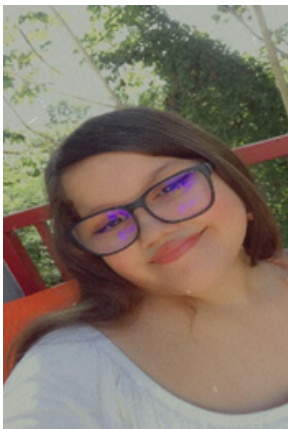


Goddess
